Genus Mammillaria and its allies - in the field and in cultivation by Zlatko Janeba

Zlatko spent several years in the south-west of the USA and has travelled to Mexico several times. Although he is not a serious *Mammillaria* specialist, he enjoys mammillarias and their allies (including *Coryphantha*, *Neobesseya*, etc). He has observed many of them in the field and he cultivates them as well. One of his favourite mammillarias is *Mammillaria* (*Phellosperma*) *tetrancistra*, which is not an easy species to grow, but is an absolutely rewarding plant to try.
